
#### Asia and the Pacific Progress in Growth and Integration

- Robust economic growth, rapid advances in technology, and liberalized regimes
- Foreign direct investment grew from \$ 4 bn in 1980 to over \$ 100 bn in 2003 (48% of ASEAN and China FDI coming from 4 NIEs)
- Increase of intra-regional trade from 35% in 1980 to 54% in 2003

#### **Asia and the Pacific Strategic Objectives**

- Gearing up resilience to crisis at both country and regional levels
- Reducing poverty although the region still remains home to 2/3 of the world's poor (620 million people)
- Building confidence among countries for further cooperation and integration

- A prominent example of regional cooperation benefits
- 3Cs: connectivity, competitiveness, and community
